Born in Shanghai and immigrated to the United States at the age of seven, Mr. Lee Hsia graduated from Rice with a B.A. in Managerial Studies in 1995. Serving two consecutive terms as President of the Rice Program Council, Mr. Hsia significantly enriched student life and created key relationships between the University and select Houston-area corporations and community organizations, especially in the arts. He is the youngest recipient of the coveted Dean Hugh Scott Cameron Award for Distinguished Service, awarded to him at graduation in May 1995. Presently, Mr. Hsia is actively involved in the Outreach Committee of the Board of Directors of the Association of Rice Alumni, Homecoming Executive Committee, the Praying Rice Owls, Rice Admissions Committee, and the Rice Alliance for Technology and Entrepreneurship. Recently he was named Chairman-Elect of Homecoming 2005 as well as Vice-President-Elect of the Board of Directors.

After Rice, Mr. Hsia pursued a career in management consulting with CSC Consulting, a division of Computer Sciences Corporation. After CSC, Mr. Hsia performed in various recruiting, sales, and management roles with progressive e-business companies. Currently he serves as the Director of Business Development at CareerLink, a Houston-based staffing firm.

In addition to his involvement at Rice, Mr. Hsia is extremely active in the community. He serves as a member of the Board of Deacons, Sunday School Teacher, and Evangelism Trainer at Dallas Chinese Bible Church. He continues to promote the arts through his involvement with the Society for the Performing Arts of Houston, Dallas Symphony Orchestra, Dallas Arts District, and the Meadows Museum at Southern Methodist University. He is Founder/Director of the Hsia Family Memorial Foundation, which supports education and the arts through financial contributions. Mr. Hsia frequently presents lectures on job search, career planning, social etiquette, school spirit, and Christian living at churches, high schools, and universities throughout the United States, including Rice. He has been quoted in national publications such as *The Wall Street Journal* and *Money* magazine, in trade journals such as *Student Leader* and *IT Recruiting*, and on various television and radio news programs across the United States.
